Hunterdon Land Trust Program Focuses on Delaware River History

Historic preservation expert Dennis Bertland will discuss life along the Delaware River during the 18th and 19th centuries at the Hunterdon Land Trust Farmers' Market on Sunday, June 4 at 10:30 a.m.

Berland will weave a fascinating tale of settlement and trade along the river. This was a time when the Durham boats -- best known for being used by General George Washington's troops to cross the river before the Battle of Trenton in 1776 -- plied the middle and upper Delaware to transport the region's products to urban markets in exchange for goods not available locally.

The program will be held in the Dvoor Farm wagon house. No reservations are necessary.

Guests can attend the program, then shop at HLT's Farmers' Market, which features roughly 18 local farmers and vendors offering organic produce, artisan bread, cheese, fresh-cut flowers,



native plants, pizza, bureks, probiotic drinks, wine, and more. The Dvoor Farm is located at 111 Mine Street in Flemington.

This program, celebrating a Delaware River town's past, is sponsored by the National Park Service's Lower Delaware Wild & Scenic Program, which aims to protect the natural, cultural and historic value of this great American river.
